




Benefits of .au direct

- Greater choice of names in .au
- Shorter, more memorable names
- Names that are easier to display
 on mobile devices



Priority allocation

- Process co-designed with stakeholders
- Pre-existing registrants provided priority to apply for exact match
- Six month period following launch
 (24 March 20 September 2022)




End of Priority Allocation Period

- 20 September 2022
- .au direct names available to public where:
 - No applications received
 - The domain name is not in contention




Registration types

- During Priority Allocation Period there are three types of registration:
 - 1. New .au direct names
 - 2. Single Match .au direct names
 - 3. Multiple Match .au direct names




New .au direct registration

- Search for available names
- Validate Australian presence, eg:
 - ABN
 - TM (Trademark) number
 - Australian driver licence
- Register for 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 years
- Available for use immediately




New name search

Domain search results




Single match

- Use <u>priority status tool</u>
- Two options:
 - Register with current registrar
 - Register with different registrar (must provide the priority-token)
- Registrar will validate eligibility
- Register for 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 years
- Available for use immediately





Multiple match

- Use <u>priority status tool</u>
- You can register with your existing or different registrar (token required) who will validate eligibility
- Name will go into pending registration status
- Refer to appendix for more information




Multiple Category 1 names

- Some registrants will have the same name in multiple namespaces
- To apply for the .au direct, apply with one domain name and decline the remainder
 - forexample.com.au Apply
 - forexample.net.au Decline
- It does not matter which namespace (e.g. net.au or com.au) you choose

id.au rule change

- From 24 March 2022 the domain name being applied for must be:
 - a) a match to a person's legal name, first name or family name
 - b) an acronym or abbreviation of the person's legal name, first name or family name
 - c) a nickname of the person
- id.au can no longer be used for personal interests or hobbies



Prohibited uses of a .au direct name

- A person must not use the licence to facilitate any conduct that is illegal, unlawful or fraudulent under Australian law
- A person must not use or inadvertently allow their domain name to be used to compromise the integrity, stability and security of the .au and global DNS
 - This includes phishing, malware and botnets

Priority status

When .au direct launches on 24 March 2022, registrants of eligible .au domain names (such as .com.au and .net.au) have until 20 September 2022 to indicate whether you to intend to apply for the exact match of their names in .au direct via the Priority Allocation process. If you choose not to apply for the exact match of a name it will become generally available.

Learn about the Priority allocation process.

Use this tool to:

- 1. Check the Priority Category of a domain name. Priority Category has the meaning given to it in auDA's .au Namespace Implementation Rules.
- 2. See matching domain names in other .au namespaces and their Priority Category
- 3. See whether applicants have lodged an application for the matching .au direct name








Prioritisation rules


- If you are a Category 1 applicant, you will have priority over Category 2 applicants
- If there are multiple Category 1 applicants, the applicants will need to reach an agreement amongst themselves on who is allocated the .au direct name
- If there are multiple Category 2 applicants, the applicant with the earliest registration date will be allocated the .au direct name.






